

Budded stock is open to the objection of suckering, but the sucker nuisance is not serious if care is taken to place the point of union of stock and cion two inches below the ground surface. The term pot plants is used in two ways--either newly rooted cuttings from pots or old established plants that have been grown on and flowered one season in the greenhouse. A clear-cut distinction should be made between these. The term pot plant should be restricted to the latter. Plants that have been forced in greenhouses, and then turned out and put into pots and grown on in a normal condition in those pots for a season and wintered over, will make excellent, large-sized plants for outdoor planting as three-year-old stock.
